Genesis 50:15-21

¹⁵When Joseph's brothers saw that their father was dead, they said, "It may be that Joseph will hate us and pay us back for all the evil that we did to him." ¹⁶So they sent a message to Joseph, saying, "Your father gave this command before he died, ¹⁷ Say to Joseph, Please forgive the transgression of your brothers and their sin, because they did evil to you.' 



- **SHIELD:** Today's shield is from the Fifth Chief Part of the Small \mathbf{X} Catechism-Confession. You are encouraged to take a moment to review this Chief Part in the hymnal, page 326. The violet color is one of repentance. The open Bible with the words of our Lord from John 20 are the central part of the shield. Our hope of forgiveness, life, and salvation are firmly grounded upon the unchanging Word of Christ. In front of the Bible are two keys, reminders to us of the Office of the Keys Christ has given to His Church, one to bind the unrepentant and one to loose the repentant. Behind the Bible is a stole, symbolic of the Office of the Holy Ministry to which these keys are entrusted. God has given you a pastor that you may hear the Law, which would bind you, and the Gospel, by which your sins have been forgiven. This is just as valid and certain, even in heaven, as if Christ our dear Lord dealt with us Himself. This shield has been commissioned by Eric and Debbie Davidson.
